A Resolution Restricting Vehicles licensed to a Declared Weight of Not More Than 54,000 pounds on the Lake Road, also known as the State Lake Road

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 8-2001 authorizes the adoption of additional traffic regulations by local authorities that are not in conflict with the Uniform Act Regulating Traffic (K.S.A. 8-1401, et seq.) and pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2002(a)(2) local authorities may regulate traffic by means of "official traffic control devices" (such as signs); and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 8-2002(a)(7) allows local authorities to regulate traffic in accordance with the terms of K.S.A. 8-1912; and
